International Legal Counsel William E. Wilkinson (AZ): Most Worshipful Brother President Andrew Jackson.

Most Worshipful Brother Jackson journeyed to New Orleans three times. On his third and last visit to New Orleans, General

Jackson personally laid the cornerstone for his own statue to be built for a tribute to him as The Hero of the Battle of New Orleans. He excelled in horsemanship as a military officer and his statue, finally erected in 1856, portrays him as a talented equestrian in what is now called Jackson Square. Jacksor Square borders the Mississippi River at the foot of the French Quarter at the Jackson Brewery, called the Jax Brewery by locals, after Jax beer, the delectable beverage named after our Brother. Andrew Jackson was also nicknamed Old Hickory for his toughness in the Battle of New Orleans, where his 5,000 men thrashed 7,500 British regulars. The British had 2,037 casualties compared to General Jackson's 71. A photo I took of General Jackson's statue in the center of Jackson Square in October 2015 is shown above. The Masonic research for this article was adapted from *A Masonic Walking Tour of the New Orleans Vieux Carre*, written by W.B. Pierre Pete Normand, Jr., 33rd Scottish Rite Mason of College Station, Texas, with his permission. You can take the Walking Tour in New Orleans this Jan. 24-27 2016.

Most Worshipful Brother President Andrew Jackson was the Grandmaster of Masons in Tennessee for two years beginning in October 1822. He was a member of Harmony Lodge No. 1 in Nashville. There are records of his visits to other Tennessee Lodges in 1800 and 1801, although no records of his Masonic degrees survive. Grandmaster Genera Jackson introduced the famous French Mason and American Revolutionary General, the Marquis de Lafayette to the Grand Lodge of Tennessee in 1825. Andrew Jackson, a lawyer, became the 7th President of the United States from 1829 to 1837. Fraternally, William Wilkinson, Esq., International General Counsel.

A letter was written to Ms. Rebecca McMinn, Chairman of the Education and Scholarship Committee of the Pan American Round Table requesting support for our Wolcott Foundation Program. Ms. McMinn is from San Antonio, Texas and is very interested and knowledgeable in our educational program.

On a sad note, Brother Dr. Beryl Franklin, longtime Trustee of Zone 6 and Chairman of the Wolcott Foundation for many years, passed away. He will be sorely missed not only by High Twelve International but the Masonic community in Louisiana. Also, Brother Loyd C. Smith, long time Deputy Trustee for the State of Texas and Officer for High Twelve International passed away. Brother Smith was also active in the Masonic Community in Texas. His absence will be felt by us all.

For a short period of time, the Texas Grand Lodge suspended the recognition of High Twelve International in Texas. This had to do with the eligibility to membership in High Twelve International. Fortunately, this has been resolved and all our High Twelve Clubs in Texas have been able to resume all operations and activities as before.

Visited various High Twelve Clubs and was the Installing Officer at two of our Texas Clubs and Texas Association Installation of officers.
