The 2024 Midyear has come to a close, but The 103rd Annual Convention is just around the corner.

The 2024 Board of Governors Midyear Meeting was held in January in New Orleans, and Brother Rick Santella, International President has announced that **The 103rd Annual Convention will be held in Atlantic City, New Jersey beginning on July 12th till July 14th at the Tropicana Hotel.** Brother Rick and the Convention Committee have a lot of Great things planned. So save the dates and we will be getting the registration open as soon.

Attached are a few things to pass on. First will be the 2024 Mid Year Synopsis, which is a break down of all the events, announcements, and legislation that is being moved on to our Annual Convention.

Also attached is our [Ad Book Form](#) which is a filliable form. Also is the announcement for the nomination of officers for High Twelve International for the 104th Convention year. As it was announced at our Midyear Meeting, Brother Kevin Hokerk-Robinson has announced that he will not be seeking reelection as International Treasurer. We are looking for someone to take over the financial helm of the International. So if you or are interested in running for Treasurer or any other position in the International line, below are the details on how to run and the important dates to be aware of.

Interested in running for an elective office in HTI?

Members interested in running for elective office must send an email to secretary@high12.org with the following not later than 4/1/24:

1. Office intending to run for (*President, 1st VP, 2nd VP, 3rd VP, Treasurer, Secretary, & 3 Year Endowment Fund Trustee*)
2. A letter of support from your Association, if one exists.
3. A letter of support from your club(s)
4. Your statement "if elected I will serve"
5. A resume showing your qualifications

2024 Midyear Board Of Governors Meeting Synopsis

I am sending this synopsis of the 2024 Board of Governors Mid-Year Conference to all members to review the proceedings. This will also help so that your clubs can discuss how the ballot should be cast by the person who your club designates. Currently, the items that will be voted on at our 103rd Annual Convention will be the 3 By-law amendment proposals listed below as well as our annual election of officers. I will post the minutes and a shortened version of the conference to view at your leisure in the future.

The Board of Governors consists of the International Executive Officers (President, 1st VP, 2nd VP, Secretary, Treasurer, Immediate PIP, and General Counsel) as well as the Association President's. Per the International By-Laws a quorum of 9 Board of Governors, we had 11 in attendance. There were also several other Brothers present to present reports as well as view the proceedings.

At the bottom of this page is a link to the packet which was distributed at the conference with the addition of the amended by-laws that were brought to the Governing Body as well as reports that were not submitted at the time of publishing.

The 4 proposed amendments summarized below, were presented, and only 3 approved to move forward to the 103rd Annual Convention for a final vote. The one struck out was voted not to be moved to the 103rd Annual Convention.

Proposed Amendment #1 — ~~Adding Honors of the Association adding “The Title of Past State Association President may be attained by either: a) serving one year as State Association President or, b) serving 5 continuous years as State Association Secretary or Treasurer. Was voted down as the topic during the general discussion it was unclear if the Honors given would entitle an Association Treasurer/Secretary who served 5 or more years would hold the title of Past State President or would only receive the privileges of a Past State President. The Board felt clarification is needed and should be brought back at the next BOG Meeting in 2025.~~

Proposed Amendment #2 – International Endowment Fund to remove the International Treasurer from the process of investment decision in its entirety. *Was approved to be moved to the 103rd Annual Convention to be voted on by the membership.*

Proposed Amendment #3 – Removing Proxies from the voting process and only those eligible to vote, must be present to vote. And voting will be conducted via a roll call vote. *Was approved to be moved to the 103rd Annual Convention to be voted on by the membership.*

Proposed Amendment #4 – The voting membership shall consist of one vote per registered member in attendance with no credential needed except for the Club Delegate. Any other registered member in attendance may vote as a “Member-At-Large” but must provide a current HTI Provided Dues Card. Also HTI will contract with an online voting provider to conduct All voting via any smart device this Eliminating paper ballots in its entirety. All meetings will be broadcast via Zoom on an online meeting provider. *Was approved to be moved to the 103rd Annual Convention to be voted on by the membership.*

Brother Michael Clarke, Chairman of the Wolcott Foundation spoke about the changes that Washington University and how the fellowships will be distributed to the Wolcott Fellows. Brother Mike also stated that to date every University President has had a Masonic connection. The current President Ms. Ellen M. Granberg, who is

Brother Mike.

Brother Rick Santella, appointed Brothers Terry Hills PSP IL, Brother Marty Kwilosz PP, and Brother Ralph Clemmer, PIP, Chairman of the Nominations Committee. Brother Tom Brotherton read Article 2; Sec. 4 of the International Bylaws which is in reference to Nominations of High Twelve Officers on the International Level and also announced that All Nominations must be Received by the International Secretary no later than 11:59pm EST on April 1st, 2024.

After lunch Brother Rick suspended the reading of the Association President's reports and instead opened a round table discussion with all those who were in attendance and had several discussions on issues going on around the different associations and Clubs. There was also discussion on membership retention. All in all many topics were covered.

While everyone was together in beautiful New Orleans our Brothers' from At Refreshment Podcast were in attendance and on Friday they began shooting our new High Twelve informational video which if you recall had famous actor and Brother Ernest Borgnine (known for his roles in The Dirty Dozen, McHales Navy, Airwolf and the voice of Mermaid Man on the animated series Spongebob Squarepants). And they also did an on location recording of their podcast which involved all the members who attended the Midyear to take part in their show. We would like to thank Brothers Marty, Wesley, and Brock for coming out and helping us. Please give their podcast a follow on [YouTube](#), [Facebook](#), and many different podcast platforms.

The fellowship that was had during while enjoying a fantastic Dinner at Antoine's and the dinner at the hotel was enjoyed by all that were in attendance. And the speakers that were lined up were very interesting and educational. For those who are not aware we had to world renowned Masonic authors, Brother Roberto M. Sanchez who is also our First Vice President and Brother Robert L.D. Cooper. Lastly Brother Rick with the assistance of the other International Officers, initiated Brothers Robert L.D. Cooper and Brock Bousman.

I hope you found this informative and will give you and your club a better insight into how your High Twelve is being run. The International Officers and myself hope to see and meet all of you in Atlantic City, NJ, at the 103rd Annual Convention.

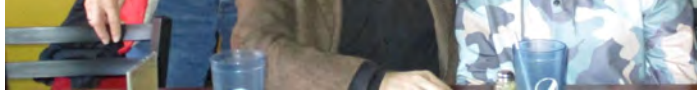

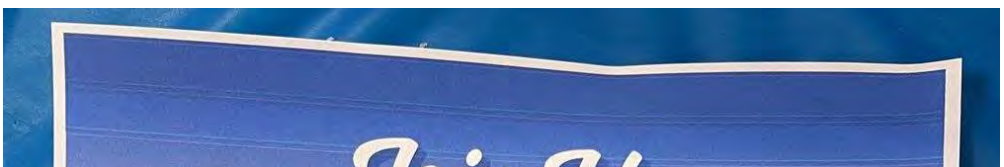
