You will notice that the Monthly Update is being delivered a bit differently this month and has a slightly different feel to it. This is a result of utilizing our membership database for the distribution this fine.

The email distribution that Brother Merv has been using has been merged/matched to the International membership database. Those emails that could not be matched received a separate email requesting that they identify themselves and their club affiliation. If they are not a member or are a widow of a member they can still receive a courtesy copy. By doing this consolidation the distribution has increased from 400 to 1,100 recipients! Thank you Merv for all your efforts the past several years in getting the word out about our goings on AND we continue to look forward to you remaining the editor with a bit of a lighter load to carry.

By now all club secretaries should have received the annual per-capita billing for the 2014-15 International year from your association Secretary. If you have not received this mailing please contact your association Secretary or this office. Statements are due and payable upon receipt and are based on the 3/31/14 Monthly Report membership numbers and not a member roster.

There is now available a secure membership directory on the International website where you can key in a members name and obtain their basic contact information and if they have a valid email address you can send them a message directly! To see this information you must be registered with the website, doing this is easy. In the upper right corner of any web page there are two empty white boxes. In the top one enter your email address, do nothing with the second box then click on "forgot password†and follow the prompts. An email will be sent to your email account provided with a link to click on. The link will give you instructions on creating a password that only you will know. Once set, return to the website and enter your email, password, check the remember box and click on LOGIN. You will now see a new tab MEMBERS ONLY. Alternatively you can contact the International office and the set password email with link can be sent to you.

NOTE from Kevin Hokerk: I received an email from one of our senior members asking for some assistance on finding items on the International Website. If you are somewhat confused on how to move around on the Website, this may assist you.

Navigation of the International website is easy as 1, 2, 3! Go to www.high12.org and the HOME page will display. Anyone/everyone will see and have access to this information which is public. Under the logo there is a dark gray bar with the main sub-pages which are equal to file folder tabs. Place your cursor over top of a TAB and the pages within that page are displayed, move your cursor down/over to the information you are looking for and a left click will take you to the page. Alternatively you can click on the any of the TABS and the page will open up and another gray bar will appear if there are sub-pages with additional information.

Each page has a little printer icon to the right of the gray bar so that page can be printed or saved.

Any text that is underlined is an active link that will take you to another page, open a document or play a video file in the case of  view a video message from Brother Ernest Borgnine'. Most  documents' will be in an Adobe PDF format and requires that you have Adobe Reader installed on your computer. A down load link for Adobe Reader is located on the Club Secretary TAB if you need to download it. In the UPCOMING EVENTS list the next 12 events are listed, click on the link and you will be taken to the detail information about that event including registration forms etc.

A recently added feature for *members only* is a *directory* of the International membership. To access this information you first must be an *approved member* of High Twelve International. At the top right of each page there is a log in where you enter your email address and password. The FIRST fine you attempt to log in you will need to key your email address and then click on †forgot password.†You will receive an email with a link to click on to set your password. Once logged in you will see a new TAB *Members Only* where the Directory is located.

Wolcott Foundation Trustee Zone 8 Merv Harris, PIP (FL): It gives me a great deal of pleasure to be able to provide an article about one of our Senior Wolcott Fellows, whom I met about ten years ago, when he was the guest speaker at the Florida State High Twelve Convention in Daytona Beach. He and his young son came down for our Convention and as a special treat he took his son to Disney World. His son was only seven at the fine and was the best mannered young man I believe we ever met. Some of the Ladies mentioned that they wished their children or grandchildren were like him.

His name is Todd Brighton and he is employed with the U.S. Department of Justice. Todd currently serves as an Enforcement Coordinator within the Justice Department. His agency, the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA), supports law enforcement, courts, corrections, treatment, victim services, technology, and prevention initiatives that strengthen the nation's criminal justice system. During his 23-year career in Federal service, Todd has served on a number of national scope programs, including Tribal Strategies Against Violence, Community Policing, Project Safe Neighborhoods, first responder line-of-duty death investigations, and a national system designed to protect consumers from vehicle fraud.

Todd grew up in Wyandotte, Michigan and obtained his Bachelor of Business Administration degree from Western Michigan University in April 1988. He began his professional career with the Saturn Corporation at General Motors. In 1989, he was selected to receive a Wolcott Fellowship to pursue a

graduate degree at The George Washington University (GWU) in Washington, D.C. After graduating with a Master's Degree from the Elliott School of International Affairs, Todd was one of 200 recent graduates selected for the Presidential Management Fellows Program, a two-year development program established to attract young graduates to Federal service. Todd is a Master Mason and a member of Alexandria-Washington Lodge #22. He and his wonderful 17 year old son David currently reside in Alexandria, Virginia.

While talking to Todd at one of the GWU functions for the Wolcott Trustees, he mentioned that his son may accompany him again on this trip. We look forward to seeing both of them and I understand he is a straight "A†student at his high school and is very active in sports and organizations. I guess it must be "Like father, like son.â€

Todd did mention that his father, who is now 93 years old and living in Fenton, Michigan was the President of his Hi-12 Club back in the 1990s and is a life-member of Wyandotte Lodge #170, now known as Trenton Wyandotte Lodge #8. Todd said he knows his dad was very proud of the fact that his son became a Mason and also that he was so greatly helped by the members of High Twelve.

Brother Don Travis to his club members: My High Twelve Brothers: I took action, as Secretary and Chair of Junior Citizen of the Month Program (wonder why we have never thought to list that on the boiler plate inside our Lodge Trestle Board? It is the Lodge's program administered by us), and contacted the California State Hi-12 Secretary about rosters of those of whom they were aware from the Burbank, Downey, and Whittier High Twelve Clubs of whom we were told they had turned back their Charters.

He quickly obliged and sent me three rosters of about 50 names total. I created a labels page for these an printed them out. I then created a one page outreach letter and encouraged them to give our Club a try. You will see below the approach I took. I used the funds you turned over to me from the canceled JCofM gift cards and mailed, on Friday, 50 copies including those of our Club who do not have E-mail service.

Now, I am not too hopeful of results from these Brothers, who would have to travel a distance, but hey, what if a few of them do and we have more hands to applaud our JCofM Program recipients?! That is all we ask of them. Any questions or comments? Thanks, Don Travis.

Letter: Many of our High Twelve Clubs are hurting for membership. Ours is no different. It is tough to get new members. Members live so spread out. Jobs are not held by them in the Montebello area, a critical element for past success of High Twelve. This is a sign of the times in a mobile society.

What our Club does ten times a year (four times each for Montebello and Schurr High and twice for Vail High) is present a Junior Citizen Award of the Month to a student selected by their school. They are invited to lunch, as is their family if they can get away, and a school representative: a Counselor, an Activities Director, or a Principal brings them.

They give a brief history of their high school experience, their hopes for the future, and they are impressive! We present them a plaque they can take home and their name is added to a permanent plague at their school. Their picture is taken, and with their bio, appear in the next edition of our Lodge newsletter. Copies are sent to them at school. They also become eligible as seniors for our larger selection of scholarships by applying for same.

This is a community service underwritten by Montebello-Whittier Lodge #323 and monthly administered by Montebello High Twelve Club #422. We are not asking you to become members. We are seeking men and women who would support this program and these young persons. You do not need to RSVP. You order from the menu and pay Hye.

Would you please attend, if only in the months, we salute these young people, have the lunch you are already going to have, and give more hands of recognition and applause?!
