The current Bylaws only allow Master Mason to join High Twelve Clubs. I'm suggesting the possibility of changing the membership eligibility to All Masons in good standing. The basis for my suggestion is that on 25 September 2012, California Grand Lodge implemented Resolution 11-06 and 07 requiring all Entered Apprentices and Fellowcraft to pay Lodge dues effective 1 October 2012. This change, of course, requires all California Lodges to open their stated meeting on the First Degree of Masonry.

We need to have a discussion on the pros and cons of this proposal so please plan on joining us in Las Vegas on 12 January 2015. If you cannot attend, please mail us your comments and we will share same with the members in attendance. We need to continue thinking of positive initiatives and strategies for the future of High Twelve. Unfortunately High Twelve Clubs and members are still declining. Let's find ways to reverse this trend!

As you know Bylaw Changes must be voted on at the Annual High Twelve Convention and this is only possible if passed at the Mid-Year-Meeting.

- Click on 'forgot password' link
- An Email will be sent to the Email address you entered with a link to click on to set your password
- Remember the Email and password for future use!

Once logged into the HIGH TWELVE INTERNATIONAL Website

- A new 'tab' will now be visible on the far right side of dark gray bar called MEMBERS ONLY
- Click on the DIRECTORY sub tab
- It may take a minute or so for the Membership Records to be loaded depending on your Internet connection
- Information is displayed in ascending order by Association then club number
- Searching can be done by FIRST, LAST, FIRST & LAST, LAST & FIRST names
- All results will be displayed
- Find the member you are looking for and click on that Record
- The details for that person is displayed
- Click on SEND MESSAGE to send a quick message to their Email address -- if provided
- Click on EMAIL to use send an Email using your default Email process

Coming back to the Website to use the directory

- In the upper right start keying your Email address
- If you checked the REMEMBER ME box your Email address will appear, select it and the Email address and password will be filled in
- Click on the LOGIN button and the Membership Online tab will be displayed
- If the password cannot be remembered click on forgot password link, click on the link in the new Email sent to you and reset the password

We also live in the largest complex in the world, which has 56 golf courses with over 600 holes and it certainly is the top choice for its residents. We also have three town squares with free entertainment every night of the year.

The Board talked about ways to increase membership but could not think of a good way to do it. Then, we thought that Masons travel on their stomachs, then we came up with an idea that we find is making us visible to the Masonic organizations in our area.
