We spoke almost every day on requests or things that needed attention. Kevin was always thinking of ways to make life easier for the club secretaries. It was frustrating at times, when the State Association Secretaries or clubs secretaries failed to send in their monthly reports. Some of the clubs feel that it too much bother to file a monthly report. It really hits home when a wife or relative calls to have their husband or father's name removed from a mailing that had been generated from the High Twelve International Office. We can only work with the information that we have

received from the State Associations or clubs.

I would like to thank my Officers for their support as well. We had our monthly conference call meetings so that everyone was kept informed on all issues.

I did not make all of my visits to the PA clubs as I had planned. Some clubs met on the same day as others or they changed their meeting times.

I had hopes that we would be able to have all the 2014-2015 per capita dues paid before the 2015-2016 year billing was issued but that was not realized.

I believe that our midyear meeting in Las Vegas was very successful and we were able to accomplish a lot and those that were in attendance for the first time learned how High Twelve Internal functioned and how what we were trying to do as support for the State Associations and individual clubs.

It takes a team effort if we are going to grow our ranks. We cannot keeps going if the State Associations and individual clubs are not willing to do their part in keeping a two way flow of information going between the International Office. I am pleased to see the new clubs in California, Louisiana and Michigan start up. We still had a negative number for membership because of Club closings. Pennsylvania had a hard hit when it lost the club that we had at the Masonic Village in Elizabethtown, PA. This club failed because they could not get anyone to take the President or Secretary Offices. We still have the possibility of formation of other clubs coming on line so that is good news. It will take everyone working together to turn around this membership loss.

The committee for the Annual Convention in June has been working hard to make your stay in Philadelphia a pleasant one.

If you have not sent in your reservations I urge you to do so now. You will enjoy your stay with us in Philadelphia.

International 1st Vice President Jerry Saville, PSP, and (CA): Brethren, as we roll into June it must be Convention time again and back to the great city of Philadelphia. What a great location to tour, and reflect, on the history of our great Nation $\hat{a} \in$ "the greatest country in the world. Join us the last weekend this month!

One of the Amendments up for vote this month is a change to High 12 Membership Eligibility. I presented this amendment at the Mid-Year-Meeting last January in Las Vegas. The Governing Board voted to pass this Amendment to the June Convention for a vote.

The current Bylaws only allow Master Masons to join Hi-12 clubs. This amendment, if approved, will change the Hi-12 membership eligibility to All Masons in good standing. The basis for my Amendment is that on 25 September 2012, California Grand Lodge implemented Resolution 11-06 and 07 requiring all Entered Apprentices and Fellow Craft to pay Lodge dues effective 1 October 2012; and mandated that all California Lodges open their stated meetings on the First Degree of Masonry. I look forward to an open discussion on this Amendment.

We need to continue thinking of positive initiatives and strategies for the future of Hi-12. Unfortunately Hi-12 Clubs, and members, are still declining. Let's find way to reverse this trend! And speaking of (positive) initiatives and trends 3 new Hi-12 clubs have opened in California, Michigan and Louisiana since the last newsletter. Let's open a new club in your State!

If you have thoughts of running for an International Hi-12 position and did not submit your intent letter to the International Secretary-no problem! You can be nominated from the floor at the Convention. As I write my last article as your First VP we do not have a 3rd VP candidate. That said you can run for any Hi-12 Officer position $\hat{a} \in \mathbb{C}^{+}$ competition is always good and organizationally healthy.

THE WOLCOTT FOUNDATION - AN INVESTMENT IN THE FUTURE OF OUR COUNTRY

The Wolcott Foundation, as we know it today, came into existence in 1951 as a result of a suggestion by Dr. J. Wallace Forbes at the High Twelve International Convention in Chicago, to establish an annual scholarship in diplomacy and statesmanship in one of the colleges or universities that offered such subjects. The George Washington University entered the picture when Dr. Forbes and his associates were discussing the work being carried out at the George Washington University in the subject areas of Government and Foreign Affairs. The sum of \$1,800.00 was appropriated for the tuition for a student at the University to fund one year of graduate studies. This year, 2015-2016, the cost is over \$66,000.00 for 40 semester hours, which is what is now offered by the Wolcott Foundation. The Foundation provides the funds to finance the tuition leading to a Master's Degree in the area of Government Service. These graduate programs are offered in one of the following: School of Business for International Business Administration, the Trachtenberg School of Public Policy and Public Administration, or the Elliott School of International affairs.

The qualifications for an appointment are that the applicant must be a U.S. Citizen, less than thirty years of age at the time that the Fall Semester of the year of application begins, be a graduate of an accredited college or university and has a belief in the existence of a Supreme Being, and be enrolled, or enrolling into the appropriate school at the George Washington University. The applicant is expected to exhibit outstanding academic, civic and social credentials and demonstrate a commitment to the Masonic ideals of high ethical and moral standards but is not required to have Masonic affiliations. Each selectee is also required to enter into a Contract with the Wolcott Foundation to enter into public service with a federal, state or municipal body. There are no restrictions in regard to race, religion or gender. The description, requirements and application procedure are contained within the Wolcott Foundation Web Page: www.wolcottfoundation.com. The applicant need not set pen or pencil to paper.

The application must be completed and submitted via computer.

The Wolcott Program has a history of over sixty years and has encourage well over 400 students to go forward to establish an outstanding and productive record of leadership and success in government service. All of this has been possible only through years of support from the members of High Twelve, High Twelve Clubs and other interested individuals. The Wolcott Board of Trustees is composed of eight Trustees, each elected from within the Zone which they represent, and serve for a term of five years and may be elected to succeed themselves.
