
1st International VP, Roberto Sanchez - TX

The Wolcott Foundation Inc. Board of Trustees Contract, Investment, and Selection Changes with George Washington University (GWU) November 2023

The Board of Trustees of the Wolcott Foundation and George Washington University have been partners in providing Highly Qualified Students seeking Graduate Degrees in Public Service for 63 years. Wolcott Fellowships, provided by funds from High Twelve International members during that time, have been invested with great care by the Foundation. The results of those investments have allowed the Foundation to fund over 500 GWU students' tuition providing our country with outstanding public service career-focused individuals with Masonic values and principles serving the citizens of the United States in various positions around the world.

The Wolcott Board of Trustees, to ensure the continuance of Wolcott Fellowships at George Washington University in perpetuity, have entered a contract to create a "Wolcott Foundation Fellowship Trust Fund" as part of the George Washington University overall investment program. George Washington University will make tuition payments for all Wolcott Fellowships directly from the Wolcott Foundation Fellowship Trust Fund. This arrangement along with future additional outside funding, will provide Wolcott Fellows with the necessary tuition to complete their master's degree in public service from the George Washington University School of Business, the Elliott School of International Affairs, or the Trachtenberg School of Public Policy and Public Administration.

George Washington University will administer the Wolcott Foundation portfolio of investments. Approximately \$4 million dollars in value, was moved from the Wolcott Foundation Investment Accounts to the George Washington University Investment Program. GWU will administer the investments without fees or charges to the Wolcott Foundation. In addition, the Wolcott Foundation will now be added to the GWU annual alumni donation program, allowing GWU alumni to contribute all or a portion of their annual contributions to the Wolcott Foundation Fellowship Fund.

George Washington University Administrative personnel who have worked with the Wolcott Foundation for many years will now evaluate all Wolcott Fellowship applications and determine which applicants meet the educational, public service-oriented, and Masonic values and moral standards required of Wolcott Fellows. The university evaluators and the Wolcott Board of Trustees have worked together to develop a new set of questions to assist them in selecting students who understand the meaning of Masonic values and moral standards and have demonstrated those values during their lives.

While the Wolcott Board will no longer be performing the selection of the Wolcott Fellows, the board will have an opportunity to review the selections and give feedback to the selection committee concerning the adherence to Masonic principles.

The Wolcott Foundation Board of Trustees, after many years of working closely with members of the selection committee, feel confident that all selections will meet the same criteria as when the Wolcott Trustees were making the selections.

Wolcott Trustees to Join New GWU President At the Wolcott Foundation GWU Fellowship Funding Celebration

The George Washington University Office of the President has announced a press conference and reception celebrating the new Fellowship Funding Agreement between the Wolcott Foundation and George Washington University.



The event will be held at George Washing-

ton University on Monday, November 6, 2023. A reception will follow with invitations sent to all senior and current Wolcott Fellows residing in the Washington, DC area.

Dr. Ellen Granberg Ph.D. is the 19th President of George Washington University and the first female President in the 203-year University history. Dr. Granberg will participate with the Wolcott Foundation Trustees in signing the new Wolcott Foundation Fellowship Trust Fund agreement. The ceremony will follow Dr. Granberg's inauguration ceremony as the new President of George Washington University.

Joining Dr. Granberg and the Wolcott Foundation Board of Trustees will be administrators who have helped create this new agreement and will be instrumental in choosing the Wolcott Fellows and administering the Foundations Fellowship Program and Trust Fund.

The Villages High Twelve Club #674 - FL

The Villages High Twelve met for its regularly scheduled meeting at the Cottage Inn Restaurant in Lady Lake, Florida. The meeting was well attended with 10 members and 8 guests (including one prospective new member) in attendance. Featured at the meeting was Pastor David Houck and his assistant "Stormy." Pastor Houck manages a charitable foundation known as the SoZo Kids of the Forest and has worked with and cared for destitute and distressed kids and families subsisting in the Ocala National Forest for going on 31 years. Pastor Houck works daily with kids and families living in the most dire of circumstances who lack the most basic necessities of life including running water, bathrooms, education. Pastor Houck's charity focuses on helping the kids to learn a vocation and obtaining clean clothes and simple articles of personal hygiene. Many of those living in the forest succumb to drugs and participate in other detrimental activities. He has many successes, but also many losses. The club donated a check to his charity for \$200.00 and additionally, members present took up a collection and donated an additional \$360.00. We also donated a box of new clothes and shoes of varying sizes and personal hygiene products, which were greatly appreciated. Tuskegee Airmen/WASP Event Sponsored by Quincy Masonic High Twelve Club #40

Our Quincy Masonic High Twelve Club #40 in Quincy, Illinois, hosted the Tuskegee Airmen/WASP Traveling Exhibit at the Quincy Regional Airport, from October 4th - 8th. On the 4th and 5th, we had students from the Colonel Gorge Iles Elementary school. Colonel Iles was a Tuskegee Airman, who was born and raised in Quincy and the new school was named after him. Also attending the event, were veterans from the Illinois Veterans Home, and the nephew (from Madison, Wisconsin) and cousins of Colonel Iles, which helped make our exhibit come to life. One of the comments of an Iles student was, "*This is a day I'll never forget*", and another told her mother, after seeing the videos, "*That was inspirational*" and "It showed I can do anything I want to do". These statements made all the planning, time and efforts of our club worthwhile.

The exhibit consisted of a 53-foot semi-trailer, that extended to 40 foot wide and held a 160-degree screen on which two fifteen-minute videos were shown, depicting the adversities the Airmen and WASP experienced while becoming pilots. The women were not big enough and both

African Americans and women were considered not smart enough to fly. Were those mind sets back then, ever proven wrong. Out of 173 combat missions, the airmen lost bombers on 7 missions and of 311 missions, during WWII, only lost bombers on 26 missions compared to the average of 46 of other squadrons.

Also in the exhibit was an 80-year-old, P-51C Mustang plane painted to the "Red Tail" colors. This plane is only one of four left flying today, and flew into and out of Quincy. What a sight to see and hear.

Attending were people living 120 miles from Quincy, as a result of our news coverage and advertising.

While our club was hoping to break even on this event, with the help of great sponsors and generous donations to the event, if appears additional funds were realized to fund some of our community service projects.

A direct benefit to our club was obtaining a new member as a result of hosting this event. Our event was considered a total success, over 500 students, many veterans and an estimated total of over 2,700 people were in attendance.
